I think one of the best ways to meet and make new friends is to volunteer, so I've made these opportunities our front page story this month.

The **COA Friday** program has been a huge success, and if you haven't checked into their programs you're missing a great resource. Besides lunch and Bingo, they offer many support programs you should check out. **They also need volunteers**; help them out once a month, or more if you're able.

However, many of us are concerned about the new **income based contribution scale** the COA has launched. After several conversations about this with COA Director Lynn Coursey, I want to emphasize the following:

- 1. **All contributions are voluntary**. The "suggested contribution" is simply that. You are free to decide how much, if any, you wish to contribute.
- 2. **No one will be refused service** who meets the age requirement (age 60+ or spouse of someone 60+). If you are broke, the meal is absolutely free.
- 3. You are not required to reveal or verify your income.
- 4. Current COA members will not be asked to sign a new contribution agreement until the new fiscal year Oct 1.

I agree that \$2 for such an excellent lunch is "too good to be true," especially when the actual cost is over \$7. But this is a subsidized program, and we pay a local tax to the COA. I hope those of you who are able will increase your contributions to the \$3.50 level, or higher if you wish. And I hope that by October 1 the COA will amend this policy for a more reasonable approach.

Of course, each of you should decide for yourself how much to pay. **But don't let this change stop you from coming!** They want your attendance and need the increased numbers they get from the Resort's participation.

I think it's a win-win. So invite some friends and keep coming! God Bless!


