Our mild winter and early spring not only damaged the fruit crops.; it also allowed weed growth in the lake to get a head start on what is looking like a bumper crop. Fertilizer runoff - another culprit - was aided by high water levels and heavy drainage from surrounding fields.

The resort will again be treating the marina for weeds. The first application is scheduled for June 6. We also plan to treat the weeds in our two swimming areas. Watch for signs posting any restrictions on swimming, fishing or watering after treatment.

Meanwhile, **Friends of Portage Lake** is struggling to raise funds for the limited amount of weed control their budget allows. That's why it is so important that you support this group with your membership and donations. If we fail to control the invasive weeds, the task will become even worse, and costs will multiply.

The **Double Time Triathlon** returns June 2! Roads will have traffic restrictions from 5 am until the last racer finishes - probably around 10:30 am - so watch for volunteers and follow their directions.

New this year is the Duathlon option, where racers run -bike-run, skipping the swim portion. Watch for an early wave of runners along Lakeshore & North Beach Drives.

**Please arrive at your spectator position before the race starts at 8 am.** Best viewing will be on the ridge from the tennis courts south, to see swimmers run to the transition area, race out and back on bikes, then out and back on foot. **No dogs along the race route please!**

Race etiquette is to always cheer for everyone - fast and slow - when they pass. To save your voice, bring a small cow bell or other noisemaker. It'll make 'em smile!

### SUMMER SAFETY TIPS

- ◆ **Do not obstruct traffic** while visiting on your golf carts. Pull off the side of the road and keep a clear path for vehicles coming and going.
- ◆ **CALL MISS DIGG and Phil** before digging!
- ◆ **Supervise children** while in CB, using lawn mower, swimming or playing on the playground.
- ◆ **Golf carts** must have a licensed driver 21 years old or older seated beside any unlicensed driver.
- ◆ **Respect the rules of the road:** one-way street, traffic circle, stop signs, speed limit 10, etc.
- ◆ **Use the Buddy system:** avoid doing strenuous activities alone! Partner to launch boats, put in docks, or work out in the exercise room.
- ◆ **Be prepared:** keep flashlight, emergency radio, drinking water supply, fire extinguisher, blanket, & rain coat. Check smoke & CO<sub>2</sub> detectors.
- ◆ **Golf Carts: Do not overload your cart...**
- ◆ **Walkers: Please use the Sidewalks...** thanks!

### PET CARE & SUPERVISION

*Please remember to follow the rules that you agreed to when you registered your pet.*

**INDOOR PETS ONLY:** All pets must be kept inside the home/RV except when **attended on a short hand-held leash while outside. No pet is allowed outside unattended.** This includes while on an open porch or deck.

**CLEAN UP:** Pet owners are responsible for the immediate removal of all pet excrement and litter.

**RESTRICTED AREAS:** Pets (other than service animals) are not allowed on swimming or playground areas, or in the clubhouse, rest rooms, office, or other common buildings. No pet may invade the privacy of anyone's home site, campsite, flowers, shrubs, etc.

**LEASH AREAS:** Pets may be walked on a short leash (max. 8 ft.) on streets, sidewalks, trails & common areas (except restricted areas above).

**PET RUN:** Pets may run loose in designated areas outside the park; **however, pet owners remain responsible for their supervision and for clean-up of excrement.** Designated areas are only: open field west of water tower or the mowed area west of the wastewater lagoons. **Leashes are required on all other trails and paths.**

**NOISE:** Noisy or unruly pets, or those causing a legitimate complaint, may not remain in the community. Disturbances such as barking, snarling, growling, etc. is cause for revoking permission to keep your pet. **Pets prone to making noise may not be left home alone.**

**NO ROPES:** Pets may not be staked, chained, roped or tied to anything **other than a hand-held leash.**

**NO ENCLOSURES:** Fenced-in enclosures, kennels and dog houses are not allowed.

**NO SIGNS:** "Beware of Dog" or similar notices are not allowed.

*We ask that you discourage your visitors from bringing pets. You are required to register and pay a fee for all visiting pets.*
