Lakefront Restrictions in Place

The monsoons have left everything soggy, and the lakefront is wet & fragile. Please observe all signs restricting access, and pay attention so you don't damage the lawn or get stuck.

As of today, **the golf cart path is closed at the end of the tennis courts.** Everything between the playground path and the lake is wet. Please avoid this area and **use the marina path to reach the peninsula by golf cart.** Please check with Mark or Phil before driving anything bigger than a golf cart to the south lakefront.



Because of the wet conditions, we are unable to erect the tent at this time. The stakes cannot hold in the wet soil. Watch the sign board for updates. Thanks!

Mailbox 1 - 2 - 3's

Thanks for your patience as we get the locking mailbox stands ready. We received 22 requests to install your own locking box. Please finish your installs ASAP. Jane needs switch everyone at the same time.



Sorry, we cannot add any more boxes to this list. Jane can only re-sort her delivery order once this year. Our plan is to start rebuilding the existing stands to make room for the wider boxes without changing the order. Once this is done, we will allow you to replace our box with your own locking box.

1. Use the drop box for outgoing mail. Every time.
2. Pick up your mail. Every day. (or ask a friend)
3. Put a hold on your mail when you are away.

Only YOU can safeguard personal information that is often passed via the mail. Follow the mailbox 1-2-3's and you will greatly reduce the likelihood of having problems. For even better security, consider renting a postal box at one of the local post offices or from a mail center.

- * The **laundry room** and the **fish house** are open. Please do not enter if another person is already inside. Wipe down all commonly touched surfaces after use. Cleaning supplies are provided (inform the office if they are absent).

When the Stay-at-Home order ends, we will begin to open them on a limited basis. This will involve providing sanitization supplies for residents to use, in addition to a regular disinfection schedule in these locations. When they are open, please only enter these locations if necessary, maintain social distancing, and follow all posted regulations.
- * **Snowbirds:** Please self isolate when you return for the recommended 14 days to make sure you have not been exposed on the trip.
- * If you have experienced any symptoms, or have been exposed to anyone experiencing symptoms, self isolate and avoid all community spaces

Be health conscious and courteous of others. Please wear a mask when indoors or near people, clean and sanitize regularly, and be kind and patient with each other as we all endure these difficult times.

Emergency Weather

- ◆ When storms are forecast, stay tuned to TV or radio. Don't depend on just the sirens - they may fail or be hard to hear. If in doubt seek shelter.
- ◆ Have cell phone, flashlight, batteries, emergency phone #'s, medical/ prescription info
- ◆ Unplug unneeded appliances (coffee, toaster, TV, video, microwave, computer).
- ◆ Stay away from windows, doors, porches. Don't shower or bathe during thunderstorms.
- ◆ Stay clear of downed lines & anything they touch.
- ◆ **Clubhouse will be opened** in case of severe weather. Wear a mask please!

Recycling Don'ts:

No Styrofoam. No plastic bags! No packing materials!



No electronics! Take TV's, computers, monitors, cell phones, and other electronics to the county recycling day or to another approved recycler.

Metal goes in scrap metal pile (SW corner of south storage area). No refrigerators, no air conditioners. Dismantle grills and remove glass, wood, plastics, etc.

BRUSH goes on burn pile: Nothing but tree parts on burn pile. No lumber. No furniture. No tires.

Leaves, yard & garden waste goes in compost area. No plastic bags, flower pots, plant hangers, sticks, stones, etc.

COMPOST!



Take to the landfill any furniture, lumber, mattresses, construction debris, carpets, roofing, drywall, etc. **Do not place these in resort trash** except small quantities on night before pickup.
