Activities Are Back!

Effective June 22, the state adopted federal guidelines for COVID-19. The CDC standards allow **fully vaccinated** people to resume most activities without social distancing or masks. How-

ever, unvaccinated people are still advised to wear a mask and social distance, and should avoid certain high risk activities such as indoor group exercise, singing indoors, or attending crowded events whether indoors or out. As a community, we will continue to avoid high risk activities and encourage safe practices. Here's the plan for July:

- ♦ Cards and other routine activities may resume, but <u>unvaccinated people</u> must wear a mask indoors.
- **♦** Saturday coffee hour may move back indoors.
- ♦ No indoor group exercise. Yoga OK with 6 ft. isolate
- **♦** Private parties may only reserve the tent.
- Pancake Breakfast: Only vaccinated volunteers may help. Breakfast will be offered "To-Go" or dine in.
- ◆ COA Box Lunches will be served in dining room.
 Unvaccinated people must wear mask except while eating.
- ♦ Appreciation Dinner will be under the tent in August.
- ♦ Whether vaccinated or not, if anyone has symptoms of Covid-19, they must isolate and should get tested.
- ◆ Please stay at home if you have been <u>exposed</u>, or if you have any of the warning signs of Covid-19!
- ♦ If you are unvaccinated, we ask that you wear a mask at the clubhouse and office.
