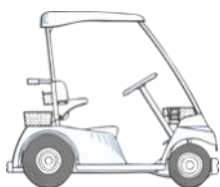

Think Golf Cart Safety



All golf carts pose safety risks. Residents who own golf carts are responsible for supervising their use, providing insurance, and instructing visitors.

IS THERE AN UNLICENSED/UNDERAGED DRIVER?

- ♦ A licensed driver age 21 or older must sit beside them, able to take physical control of the cart.
- ♦ Is the adult paying attention? Don't be looking at your phone or otherwise distracted.
- ♦ Are the adult's hands free to help? You should not be holding another child, or a dog, or....

IS THE CART SAFE WHEN IN MOTION?

- ♦ **Mechanical safety:** brakes, steering, tires, lights on after dark.
- ♦ **Operational safety:** Not overloaded. Max. 10 mph, everyone seated, arms and legs inside, not swerving, following rules of the road, yield to pedestrians, staying on trails and paths, not blocking traffic.
- ♦ **Operator Impairment:** Vision? Alcohol or drug use? If you shouldn't drive a car, don't drive a cart!

IS THE CART SAFE WHEN PARKED?

- ♦ **BRAKE-LEVER-KEY!** Always set brake, put lever in neutral and turn off (remove) key. You don't want to accidentally hit the pedal and have cart lunge forward, or for a child to hop on and hit the pedal when you're not looking.

IS THE CART PROPERLY MARKED & INSURED?

- ♦ Carts must display your lot number (left rear) and a windshield sticker issued by the office.
- ♦ Bring proof of insurance to office to receive sticker.

IS THE CART A "SOUPED UP" MODEL?

- ♦ A "souped up" cart is not allowed on the trails or grounds. It falls under the rules for ORV's and motorcycles/dirt bikes, and may only be driven on paved roads to enter and leave the park.
- ♦ Souped up carts may not be driven by unlicensed drivers on resort roads.
- ♦ If you have a programable cart, it should be set to not exceed 15 mph.
- ♦ Only turf (smooth) tires are allowed. Do not use "dirt" tires on your cart.

Primary Election Aug 2:

Multiple candidates are competing in **Republican primary races**.

With multiple candidates, some races are likely to be won with less than 50% of the vote. Since our area typically votes red, the outcome of the primary often determines who will win in the fall.



- ♦ **County Commission:** incumbent Kathy Pangle is challenged by Rusty Baker, both from Mendon. (The County Commission is changing from 5 to 7 seats.)
- ♦ **36th District State House:** incumbent Steve Carra faces Jack Coleman, Scott McGraw & Jerry Solis.
- ♦ **17th District State Senate:** incumbent Kim LaSatta is challenged by Jonathan Lindsey.
- ♦ **Governor:** 5 Republicans are on the primary ballot: Dixon, Kelly, Rebendt, Rinke, and Soldano.
- ♦ In the new **5th Congressional District**, incumbent Tim Walberg is challenged by Sherry O'Donnell and write-in candidate Bryan Trouten. (Previously we were represented by Fred Upton, who is retiring.
- ♦ **Democrat** party candidates are running unopposed.

Also on the August 2 Ballot: S.J.C. Transportation Authority is requesting a four year renewal of their 0.33 mil operational millage.

Phil's Corner

Teaching kids to drive a golf cart is a rite of passage for many at the resort. It's a fun way to learn, and most everyone does a good job of driving safely. But when not properly supervised, it is one of the most frequent sources of complaints that we receive.

Golf cart safety has been on my mind ever since some good friends were injured in a roll-over golf cart accident near their Long Lake home two weeks ago. Both Kevin and his son have broken collarbones, their granddaughter broke her jaw, and - of greatest concern - Susan suffered multiple skull fractures and head trauma.

Details of the accident are unclear; somehow a pleasant family outing turned tragic. Susan was airlifted to Bronson with life-threatening injuries. She's now home, but faces a long rehab.

I recently flagged down a cart carefully driven by a young child whose mother - seated beside her - was holding an even younger child. Grandma was on back with

two more. I asked "how are you going to control the cart if your daughter needs help?" She looked at me questioningly, set her child on the seat beside her, and carried on. This left a young child unrestrained on the outside of a crowded cart driven by an 8 year old. Not a great solution!

The article on pg.1 highlights some of the golf cart rules.

Bottom line: If you allow a child or visitor to drive your cart, it is your job to make sure everyone - on and off the cart - will be safe.

Let's have a fun - and SAFE - 4th of July!

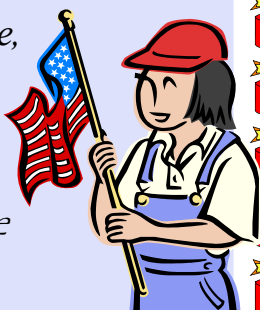
