Phil's Corner

On May 18, 1980, Mt. St. Helens blew. The associated earthquakes, explosions, ash columns and mud flows were the deadliest and most destructive volcanic eruption in U.S. history. It was spectacular!



For 10 hours ash spewed 15 miles high: 540 million tons of ash spread over 16 states & provinces. My cousins in Wallace, Idaho, remember roads closed with ash. They shoveled it with snow shovels and slid on the greasv mess when it rained.

My sister-in-law, Virginia Dale, was a Ph.D. student at the Univ. of Washington. She joined early research teams to the blast site, and implemented a long term

study of the debris avalanche field. Every 5 years Virginia and her team return for follow-up research.

Due to covid, the 2020 team is two years late, and Joseph and I are joining them! We're camping in a wilderness where few visitors are allowed. I'm psyched!

- **DRAIN** live wells, bilges and all water

DRY boats and equipment

DISPOSE of unwanted bait in the trash

IT'S THE LAW

Violation of the law is a state civil infraction. Violators may be subject to fines.

- Do not launch a watercraft or place a trailer in the water if aquatic plants are attached.
- Do not release unused bait into the water.
- Do not transport water over land in bilges and live wells.


