With Kid's Fun Day approaching, I'm particularly concerned for safety. I want to remind you to be especially observant of your guests.

A few reminders:

1. **You - the resident - are responsible for your guests. Make sure rules are communicated for their safety and out of respect for your neighbors.** Do they know where they can and cannot drive your golf cart? Walk their dog? Park their car? Park their boat? Drink beer?
2. **Children under age 12** must have a responsible adult **OBSERVING** them on the **playground** and in the

3. **swimming area.** Make sure you have a cell phone on the beach for emergencies. No rough housing!
4. **No one under 18** in Clubhouse without an adult!
5. **Unlicensed golf cart drivers** must have an adult age 21 or older seated beside them with their hands free to take control of the cart if needed. No open alcohol.
6. **The road is not a playground!** Please keep young children off the streets! Young bikers and skate boarders are no match for a UPS truck!
7. **No dogs on the playground**, in the clubhouse, or under the tent please! No dog feces in clubhouse or tent receptacles! Please carry your crap home!
8. **Visiting dogs are discouraged.** They are unfamiliar with the resort activity and their owners are not familiar with the rules. We expect visiting dogs (staying overnight) to be registered and pay a fee.

The Resort is here to share and enjoy - safely! Do your part to prevent problems so everyone can have a good time!
