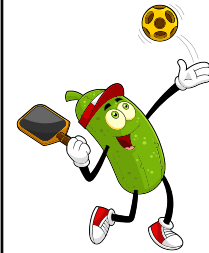

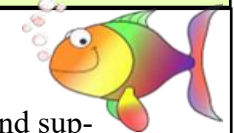

# LET'S SHUFFLE!

*shooting areas*

*this is a "biscuit"*

Equipment is stored in the lockers at the end of the tennis court. Return when done.

Please supervise children and do not walk on the court.

Shoot discs standing behind the "kitchen" with discs starting in kitchen. Do not walk past foul line.

## GAME

Either two persons (singles), or four persons (doubles).

The object of the game is to propel discs (aka biscuits) by means of a cue (aka tang) onto the scoring diagram at opposite end of court - to score, to prevent opponent from scoring, or both.

*please, don't walk on the court*

## RULES

In doubles, partners shall play on the same color at both ends of the court.

To start a game, the yellow disc is shot first.

Taking turns - yellow, then blue - until all discs are shot.

The game consists of eight frames. After both players on one side have shot their four discs, this is a completion of a frame.

A disc that does not reach (at least touch) the farthest deadzone line will be removed from the court.

*remove biscuits that land here*

**DEADZONE**

Use the silicone stored inside the equipment cabinet to spray the bottom of the "biscuits"

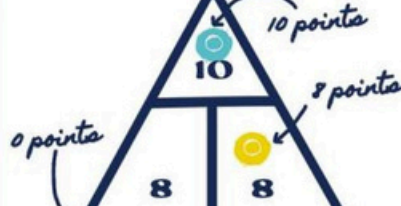
## SCORING

In order to be a scorable disc, it can't touch ANY line. (Not even a little)

Any disc that lands in the kitchen is worth -10 pts

At the end of the frame, count up the points of the scoring discs are left in the triangle.

*-10 points*



*the "kitchen" is minus 10 points*

*this is a "tang"*
